# **School Visits**

We had requests from several Waterford second grade teachers for the History of Waterford Workshop and Village Field Trip. The programs target several second



grade social studies benchmarks regarding local history.

The History of Waterford Workshop takes place at the school. It includes a PowerPoint presentation about the history of Waterford. Included in this is: why people came to Waterford, why they stayed here and how to be a 'history detective'. The workshop part of this program consists of five activity centers. These include: studying a painting of the old village of Waterford, handling historic artifacts, making community decisions then putting them on a timeline, learning about the past from vintage Waterford photographs, and using a map key to gain information from an 1872 map of Waterford.

The Historic Waterford Village Field Trip takes place on our grounds at Fish Hatchery Park. It includes a guided tour of the Log Cabin, General Store, and Train Depot. These buildings were very important in the growth of Waterford. Also included are activities from long ago. They consist of: clothes washing, vintage toys, farm tools and mattress stuffing/rug beating. Many of these were chores children would have done long ago.

We are indebted to Sally Strait for developing both of these programs that allow us to continue the WHS mission of educating present and future generations about the history of Waterford Township. We would also like to thank all our dedicated volunteers who help make these field trips a success.

# Log Cabin Day in Michigan

Have you ever wondered how Log Cabin Day came homemade candles provided the only light after sunset. about? On December 9, 1986, the Michigan Legislature passed a resolution proclaiming Log Cabin Day on June 28, 1987 for the Sesquicentennial. On that day there was a tour of seven Berrien County log cabins along with four other Log Cabin Day events in the state.

Because of public response, the Legislature passed a bill to make Log Cabin Day an annual event. It was signed by Governor James J. Blanchard on June 15, 1989. As recorded in the Statutes of Michigan: "The last Sunday of June of each year shall be known as 'Log Cabin Day'."

Michigan is the only state which has an annual statewide log cabin festival. Of the hundreds of log cabins which have been on the annual Log Cabin Day parade since 1987, at least seven were built before 1840.

The Waterford Historical Society is proud to have a log cabin on the official register of Michigan log cabins. This register includes 105 log cabins located all over the state of Michigan. Thirteen of these log cabins are located in and around Oakland County. A map and list of all the log cabins in Michigan can be found on the website of the Log Cabin Society of Michigan. Included is a description of each log cabin along with contact information and/or days and hours open to the public.

Log cabins were built by the pioneers who came west to Michigan. Yes, Michigan was the west in the early 1800's! They built their home out of logs because that was what was here. There were no stores for the first settlers. They only had what they were able to bring with them or what they could grow, make, gather, catch or hunt. Heat was provided by an open fireplace, where they also cooked their meals. Water was outside in a lake or stream. There was no electricity. Firelight and

There was no indoor plumbing. Everyone had chores, even the children. Life was rustic and simple. These were the 'Log Cabin Days'.



# Schoolhouse Chatter



In the early days everyone had to cut and donate wood for the schoolhouse stove, so let's get busy and get that stove figuratively burning and that school bell ringing!


